



## Permanent Art Collection

The Permanent Collection is developed to include contemporary Canadian art in all media. The AGM began collecting art in 1994 and was designated as a category "A" institution by the Canadian Cultural Property Export Review Board in 1995.

Featuring over 500 works the collection comprises a thematic approach to historic and contemporary Canadian artists. The Collection has focused upon contemporary art by contextualizing issues and themes in the politics of representation, identity, gender, commodity and culture, Canadiana, landscape-environment, local and global concepts. The collection is currently housed on the premises.

As a regional institution focusing on contemporary practices, the AGM seeks to demonstrate a high degree of curatorial integrity by maintaining a strong commitment to the community as well as regional and national artists. The collection has regional recognition with artists from Mississauga, Toronto as well as the geography of Canada. Currently, exhibitions are drawn from the Collection to exhibit within the AGM galleries and works are able to be on loan to other professional institutions.

The collection is available to scholars, academics, students and the public by appointment.

The AGM has currently placed a moratorium on the acquisition of new works due to the storage constraints. In this case the moratorium is defined as a temporary hold on the purchase of art due to the fact that the current storage capacity is at a premium.

Highlights of the collection are posted on the website and updated on a rotation basis with each exhibition
