


The Inspiration Lakeview Vision: What was it?





Protected views and access to the water

Continuous public access to the water's edge

Full range of land uses – residential, mixed-use, commercial, employment

Introduce an urban street and block pattern

A diversity of heights and densities

Bring transit into the middle of the site



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OPG

Opportunities for a mix of uses including a range of housing forms and densities that optimize the developable area to achieve commercial value

Region of Peel

Conformity with Places to Grow Regional Growth Plan; focus on connectivity, integration and placemaking

City Planning Collaborate with existing plans and strategies (Official Plan, Local Area Plan, Green Development Strategy, Living Green Master Plan, etc.) to link project goals and streamline implementation

CVC & TRCA Concern over the buffer area around the G.E. Booth Wastewater Treatment facility; ensure protection of waterfront ecology

Trans Works Detailed examination of environmental concerns and the multi-modal transportation requirements to support the Vision

...we also heard lots of ideas and received many comments from the public throughout the Vision process...




...moving from the Vision to a more detailed Master Plan...

What is the size, shape and feel of the water's edge?




What should happen with the OPG concrete pad?
