Focus on the environment. Ice skating rink. Public outdoor music stage. Built with universally accessible design in mind. A museum dedicated to the history of Lakeview. Landscapes that use local plants to recreate new community gardens. Affordable seniors living residences. Outdoor cafes, restaurants, entertainment. Great Lake research and education centre. A pleasant place for families. Fun for adults and kids. Convenient transit to move people in and out of this area. Creative designs. Stadium. Recognition of the history of Lakeview. Waterfront views. A multi-sport community stadium. Unique. Public art. A boardwalk with seating along the shoreline. Human scale buildings people can relate to. Mixed-Use. Year-round activity – not just summer. Use existing industrial space for film studios in the interim. A cultural community destination like Granville Island. Not just a park but a major cultural destination attracting people from other cities. Theatres for plays and operas. Wind and solar projects. Affordable homes. Harbour to encourage water events. Preserve historic buildings. Area for artists to create and sell art. Honour or commemorate the site's interesting history. Pull transit into the site. Potential to host national sporting event. Music Museum. Totally green community. Use existing industrial space for film studios in the interim. A place for everyone with integrated affordable housing. Large pier with attraction. Year round recreational area with cafes, restaurants, perhaps even a hotel or a few bed and breakfasts, children's play area. Create additional opportunities to connect to the water, bring the water to the city and the city to the water. Underground railroad themed








