



A VISION FOR CITY CENTRE PARKS AND OPEN SPACES

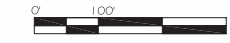
The City Hall and Library will function as a cohesive civic square designed and managed as an outdoor community and cultural center—a year-round destination where Mississauga’s diverse communities can gather together. With strong pedestrian connections between them, these spaces can bring a sense of identity to city centre.

New parklands will be created in city centre to provide an active oasis that defines the residential and civic core of the city and encourages people to interact, walk, play and celebrate. These parklands will be safe, comfortable, universally accessible, open to all cultures and ages, beautifully designed, and promote positive social and civic interaction through both casual and programmed activities. Though comprised of a number of distinct parcels separated by streets and roads, these spaces are conceived as one, cohesive park.

The Living Arts Centre will be an arts destination that contributes to an active corridor of retail, arts, and recreation connecting Square One to thousands of new residents downtown.
