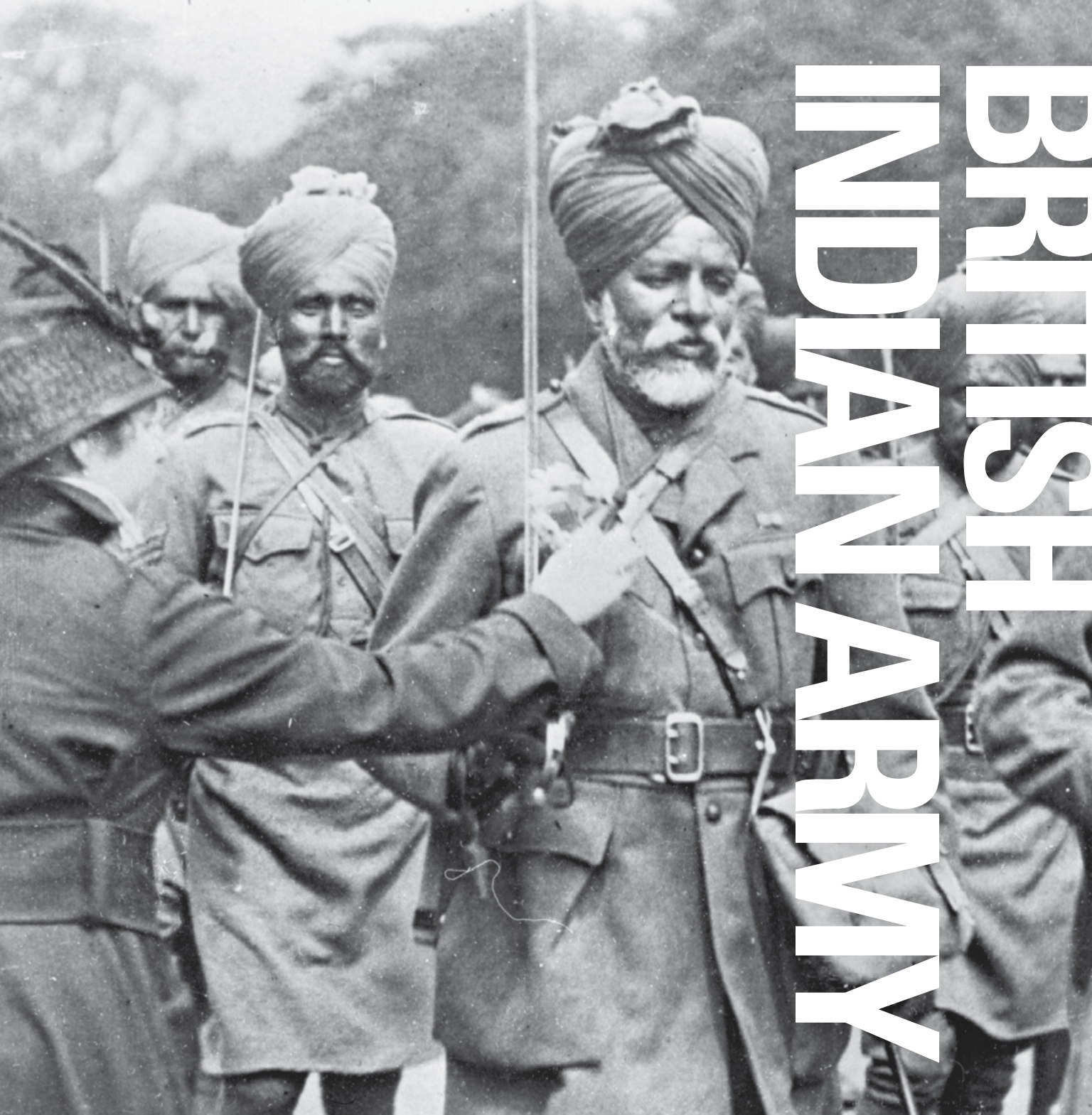

THE BRITISH INDIAN ARMY IN THE GREAT WAR, 1914 TO 1918

ON DISPLAY UNTIL JULY 20, 2014

2014 marks the centennial year of the beginning of the 'Great War' or 'World War One'. This exhibit recognizes one story unknown to many Canadians, the part played by the British Indian Army. At the time it was the largest volunteer army in the world.

The exhibit is on display in the Anchorage at Bradley Museum and is open to the public Monday to Friday 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. and Sundays 1 to 4 p.m. free of charge.
