FACILITIES ARE DEDICATED TO YOUTH PLAY

Criteria three can be described as the City of Mississauga accommodates youth by offering a number of facilities located throughout the city that involve diverse teens within their communities. Through the designation of these facilities, youth are encouraged to participate in various programs and activities.

The City of Mississauga allows youth to connect with other youth by promoting activities within their surrounding neighbourhoods through various active organizations. These organizations include: community centres, private facilities, religious institutions, designated outdoor areas (parks) and local schools. By acquiring information from websites, brochures, bulletin boards, visiting facilities, speaking to employees (youth coordinators and managers), the youth are able to find these facilities.

Through our research we found that community centres within the City of Mississauga offer a wide range of activities where youth can participate throughout the year. Several community centres dedicate specific spaces within their facilities to engage youth through various forms of play. There are a number of community centres located throughout neighbourhoods in the City of Mississauga that provide youth, ages 13-19, with opportunities to engage in various sport and art activities. Most of the community centres within the city offer the Walmart at Play program for youth aged 10-15. This program hosts a range of free drop-in activities for youth throughout the week. The Meadowvale Community Centre offers free athletic and artistic programs, such as soccer and Hip Hop dance, as part of the Walmart at Play program (Ref 3-1). Through a phone conversation with Sandy Duggens, a supervisor at Meadowvale Community Centre, stated that this particular location of the Walmart at Play program on average has an attendance of roughly 20 youth, however every community centre throughout the city offers this program. The Clarkson Community Centre also dedicates their facility to the free Walmart at Play program. Rachel Fraser, from the Clarkson Community Centre explained by phone that this program runs Tuesdays and Thursdays and consists of approximately 20-30 youth participants. Clarkson Community Centre has a youth room dedicated to various youth programs. Rachel also mentioned a specific program called the "So-You Girls" program that is offered to girls aged 9-14. This program is free of charge and is a place where youth can take part in activities such as yoga and cooking (Ref 3-2). In addition, the Chill zone is another room designated for youth within

the community centre. This room, as Rachel noted, hosts Friday night movies and games from 6:30 to 9:30pm, charging the 15-25 youth who attend \$1.50. The Clarkson Community Centre also has a BMX park connected where youth enjoy hanging out and socializing.

Other community centres within the city – Frank McKechnie, Huron, Malton, River Grove, South Common, Mississauga Valley, Burnhamthorpe and Cawthra – also have designated rooms for youth where they host their drop-in programs such as the Walmart at Play, and other programs located in the Active Mississauga guide.

The Hershey Centre also dedicates parts of their facility to youth. Areas such as the Sports Zone and Fitness Centre, offer drop-in programs for youth (Ref 3-3) as well as discounted membership rates of \$25.65 a month for their facility (Ref 3-4). The facility consists of; an ice arena for recreational skating and hockey, indoor and outdoor fields designated to soccer and football (Ref 3-4).

The YMCA dedicates their facility every Friday night from 7:00 – 10:00pm for both members and non-members. The recently launched free "Teen night" for youth ages 13-18 (Ref 3-5), the newly opened "Bills Youth Zone" located within the YMCA offers equipment such as TV, Computers, Wii, air hockey and more. This area is strictly for youth and was created to promote physical activity for youth of Mississauga. The "Bills Youth Zone" which launched Tuesday October 25th 2011, offers youth a designated area, which is flexible in terms of the time and activities that youth can engage in (Ref 3-6). Various activities take place within the YMCA that occupy a number of designated rooms throughout their facilities such as the fitness room, basketball court, and swimming pool.

The Dam is another facility, which is designated for youth play with two facilities located in Mississauga. The Dam provides a space for youth aged 13-19 to interact with one another in a supportive and friendly environment. The Dam has different drop-in events each night, for example, coffee house on Wednesdays (Ref 3-7).

There are numerous public libraries situated around the City of Mississauga. The Central Library located in the Heart of Mississauga offers exciting opportunities for youth and is also one of the largest libraries in the Mississauga library system. By contacting the Central library and speaking with James Dekens, the library youth coordinator, he noted that the Central Library dedicates an entire floor called the "Youth Zone" for the youth of Mississauga. James Dekens also mentioned that the Youth Zone area holds all the youth books and tables for teens to hang out with their friends as well as read and complete their homework. The Teen Advisory Group of the Central Library utilizes this Youth Zone for their monthly meetings. The library occasionally brings youth authors into the Youth Zone for the youth to meet and discuss the author's book (Ref 3-8).

Clarkson library, a smaller library that is vibrant with the youth atmosphere, offers designated areas that were created by youth for youth. Franca Edwards from the Clarkson library described that the library contains comfy couches, desk areas, in-demand youth books, and areas for homework, which are features that attract Mississauga youth to this library.

There are several religious gatherings and groups that provide designated areas in their churches for youth play and activities. The City Centre Baptist Church designates their basement once a month for youth events. The events start in the youth room of the church continues to local places such as Lazer Quest, then concludes the evening with more activities in the youth room. In addition, the Baptist Church welcomes non-religious youths to join in their events (Ref 3-9).

The Living Arts Centre is also a facility with different rooms designated to play. They offer various art programs in the specific art studio rooms as well as theatres for musical activities and learning opportunities (Ref 3-10). The Living Arts Centre has three floors, each with multiple rooms that are designated to different programs. Most programs are limited to the amount of youth that can register, however on average there are approximately 25-30 youth per program (Ref 3-10).

There are many private organizations that have their own facilities dedicated to youth play. CYM (Ukrainian Youth Association) has their own facility located in the Hurontario and Eglinton area. They have various planned activities for youth of Ukrainian decent, however also welcome non-Ukrainian youth. The youth pay a one-time fee in September, which allows them to participate in all events and attend every Saturday from 2:30-4:30pm (Ref 3-11). Aside from weekly gatherings, the CYM also have other activities that are taken place outside of their facility such as swimming at Frank McKechnie Community Center, and local church celebrations (St. Marys Catholic Church).

Muhammad Saleh, the Programs Manager of The African Community Services of Peel noted that the organization offers art programs to youth, between the age's of 13-19, that take place in a designated meeting room that turns into a youth room during the days that the program runs. Saleh mentioned that this program is offered at no cost and is open to the African community but also welcomes youth of different heritage (Ref 3-12). The program days vary and depend on the enrolment that on average is around 8-12 youth. During the summer time they open an extra room dedicated for play activities within their facility to accommodate the influx of youth.

The Gateway Centre for New Canadians offers multiple facilities that are designated for various events and activities. Julius A. Tiangson, Executive Director of the Gateway Centre, through a phone interview mentioned that youth between the ages 13-24 are able to use the facilities' gym, dance studio and resource room (Ref 3-13). These areas turn into the youth room for the use of computers and board games. Julius Tiangson

also mentioned that on Saturdays from 4:00-7:00pm, youth can choose to participate in various activities held at the Gateway Centre. The usual attendance is between 20-30 youth, depending on the activities being offered. These activities are free for youth who been in Canada for less than a year and a cost of \$10 for all other youth to participate in drop in activities (Ref 3-13).

The Nexus Youth Centre facility is located on the second floor of the Central Library. There are also a variety of spaces open for youth to utilise depending on the day of the week and activity in progress. While speaking with Krystal Meek, Youth Engagement Worker of Nexus Youth Centre, on Mondays, 6:00-8:00pm the "Between Us Girls" meets, the ages for this club are 14-24 and usually 5-8 youth participate. The youth have opportunities to utilize computer resources during drop-in activities (Ref 3-14). There is also a pool table and a foosball table along with chess and other play activities to use for free during anytime that the office is open (Ref 3-14). Krystal also mentioned that on Tuesdays from 6:00-8:30pm the "Artistic Youth United" use the Nexus Centre to meet, with approximately 30 youth in the club. Other activities occur on the other nights of the week.

Classic Bowl Mississauga is dedicated to youth play as they host the annual Ontario 10-Pin Youth Bowling Tour (Ref 3-15), as well as youth discounts for regular bowling. Brunswick Bowl in Mississauga is dedicated to youth play as they offer after unlimited after school bowling, pizza and drink for only \$9.99 (Ref 30-15).

The above information proves that the City of Mississauga facilities are dedicated to youth play.

ADDITIONAL SUPPORTING EVIDENCE:

City of Mississauga:

- Mississauga Youth Centres- Located at 10 Community Centres throughout the City. MYC is space within the community centre that is dedicated to youth programming and play.
- Skateboard Facilities- The City has 7 skateboard parks across the City. Iceland is a premier skateboarding facility and draws a large crowd daily but is also the location choice for major demos, competitions and special events. Other multi-use ramps include Port Credit, Clarkson, Huron Park, Malton, Churchill Meadows and the Civic Centre.
- Dirt Bike Jump Parks, 3 locations (Clarkson Park, Meadowvale Sports Park and Plum Tree Park)
- Mountain Bike Park- Ellis Leuschner Challenge Park- All the skateboard and bike facilities have had youth consultation in the design, building and celebrating of these youth facilities.
- Variety of outdoor courts and facilities (soccer fields, basketball courts, tennis courts etc)

Other Organizations:

- Peel Youth Village- Partnership between the YMCA and Region, this facility is the only transitional housing in peel for youth. In addition to housing for up to 47 youth PYV offers support services and counselling. Facilities include a gymnasium and general recreational space that is available for all youth in the community to use. Space is available to community organizations that are able to offer additional services to youth (Ref 3-16).
- Our Place Peel- offer short term housing for youth (Ref 3-17).
- Erin Oak Treatment Centre
- Community Spaces- Boys and Girls Club of Peel (Colonial Terrace, Acorn Place, Byngmount/Lakeview, Port Credit), hosting programs such as sports, games and leadership workshops (Ref 3-18).
- Large Cultural Centres and many churches have spaces dedicated to their youth groups and ministries (Ref 3-19)
- Private facilities- Playdium, Bowling Alleys, Scooters, Laser Quest, Movie theatres etc (Ref 3-15).
- High Schools and Middle Schools have dedicated youth space such as student lounges, extra curricular club space, media and student council spaces.
- South Common Centre Mall- Hosts events such as Snakes Alive! in which youth were invited to a presentation about the snakes. They were able to interact, hold and touch a variety of snakes (Ref 3-20).
- Erin Mills Youth Centre- Hosts programs for youth 9-17yrs, programs include Breakfast Club, basketball, youth personal development, Girlz Club, Teen Cuisine and special events.
- Mississauga No.1 Culture and Arts Centre- Hosts after school programs for children and youth with activities that include table tennis and piano and keyboard lessons (Ref 3-21).

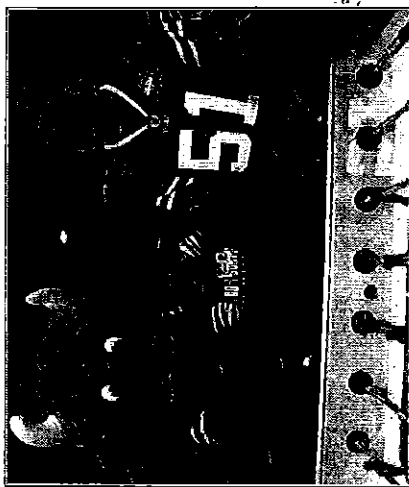

"To see the smiles on kids faces through interactions with the players was a truly inspiring moment for me," said D'Addario, a resident of Mississauga.

Bills rookies in attendance included Kelvin Sheppard, Chris Hairston, Justin Rogers, Da'Norris Searcy, Lee Smith, Chris White, Johnny White, Aaron Williams, Kamar Allen, Michael Jasper, Doyle Miller, Joshua Nesbitt and Keith Williams.

Bills mascot Billy Buffalo and members of the Buffalo Bills cheerleading team also made an appearance. Sheppard, a linebacker out of Louisiana State University, spoke to youngsters on hand about the importance of maintaining an active lifestyle. "All it takes is 60 minutes a day to go out and have fun," said Sheppard. "Drop the Playstation or Xbox controllers and get out and play some basketball or some football or whatever you like to do."

- Saturdays, 11 a.m. to 5 p.m.

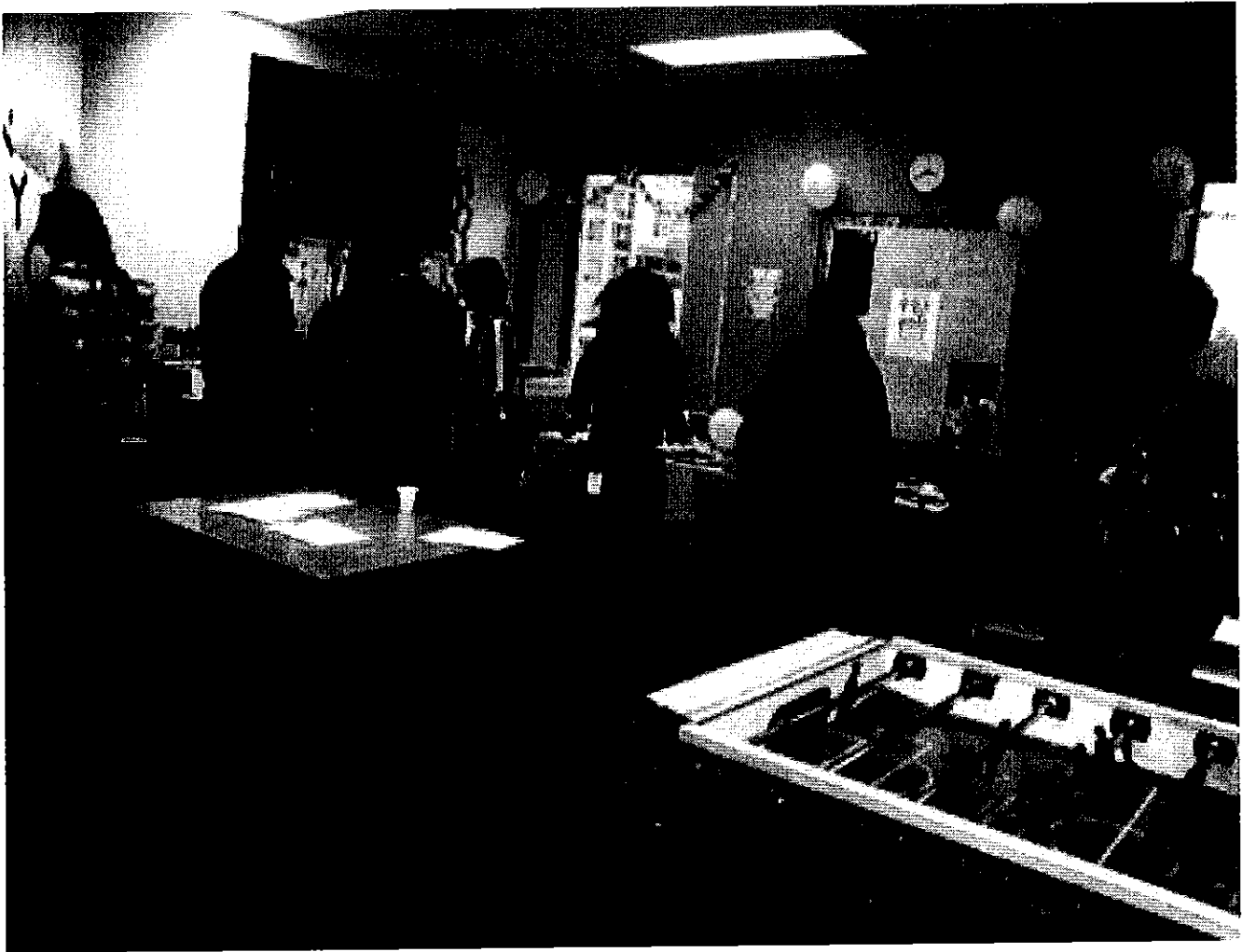
What do we do?

emergency youth shelter resource room h.y.p.e.

Many youth arrive at Our Place Peel without hope for the future. Their low self-esteem and poor decision making skills are compounded by the struggles of adolescence and feelings of loss and loneliness.

We give youth a nutritious meal and warm place to sleep but so much more. Our caring role models and counselors strive to rebuild confidence, teach life skills and help youth complete their education, choose a career and find a job.

emergency youth shelter

Adolescence and young adulthood are difficult enough without adding homelessness to the mix. The majority of youth who arrive at our emergency shelter are escaping abuse and dangerous situations which can have a devastating impact on their self-esteem, relationships and long-term health.

Our priority, as Peel Region's only emergency shelter for youth, is to provide a safe alternative to as many youth as possible. Annually we provide safe shelter and counseling to over 550 youth. Unfortunately, we had to turn away 500 more due to lack of beds, even though we knew their options were few.

Located in Mississauga, Our Place Peel's emergency shelter has 14 beds and is staffed 24 hours per day. Keeping youth in their own community is vital for maintaining their links to family, friends, school and employment.

Youth stay with us for an average of three weeks. During that time, our trained staff provides crisis counseling and referral services for ongoing clinical support and counseling. We also help youth develop and achieve realistic goals and facilitate family reconciliation, if appropriate.

Depression and suicide are rampant among street youth. At a time when many youth feel no one cares about them, we provide a supportive, empathetic environment to help them overcome the hurdles they're facing and take responsibility for their future.

Every kid needs a caring role model – someone to listen, cheer her successes, help her up when she's down and steer her in the right direction when she's off course. Most kids who turn to Our Place Peel don't have someone like that in their lives.

Our Resource Room, located in our Emergency Shelter in Mississauga, helps to fill that void.

Our Resource Counselor and college students on placement provide one-on-one counseling to any youth aged 16 to 21.

We offer workshops on topics these young people can use, such as budgeting, resumé and cover letter writing, interview preparation, employment standards, finding accommodation, and landlord and tenant issues.

Youth can also access free computer, Internet, photocopier, fax, and telephone services to assist with job or housing searches and information on a variety of other issues, community resources and agencies.

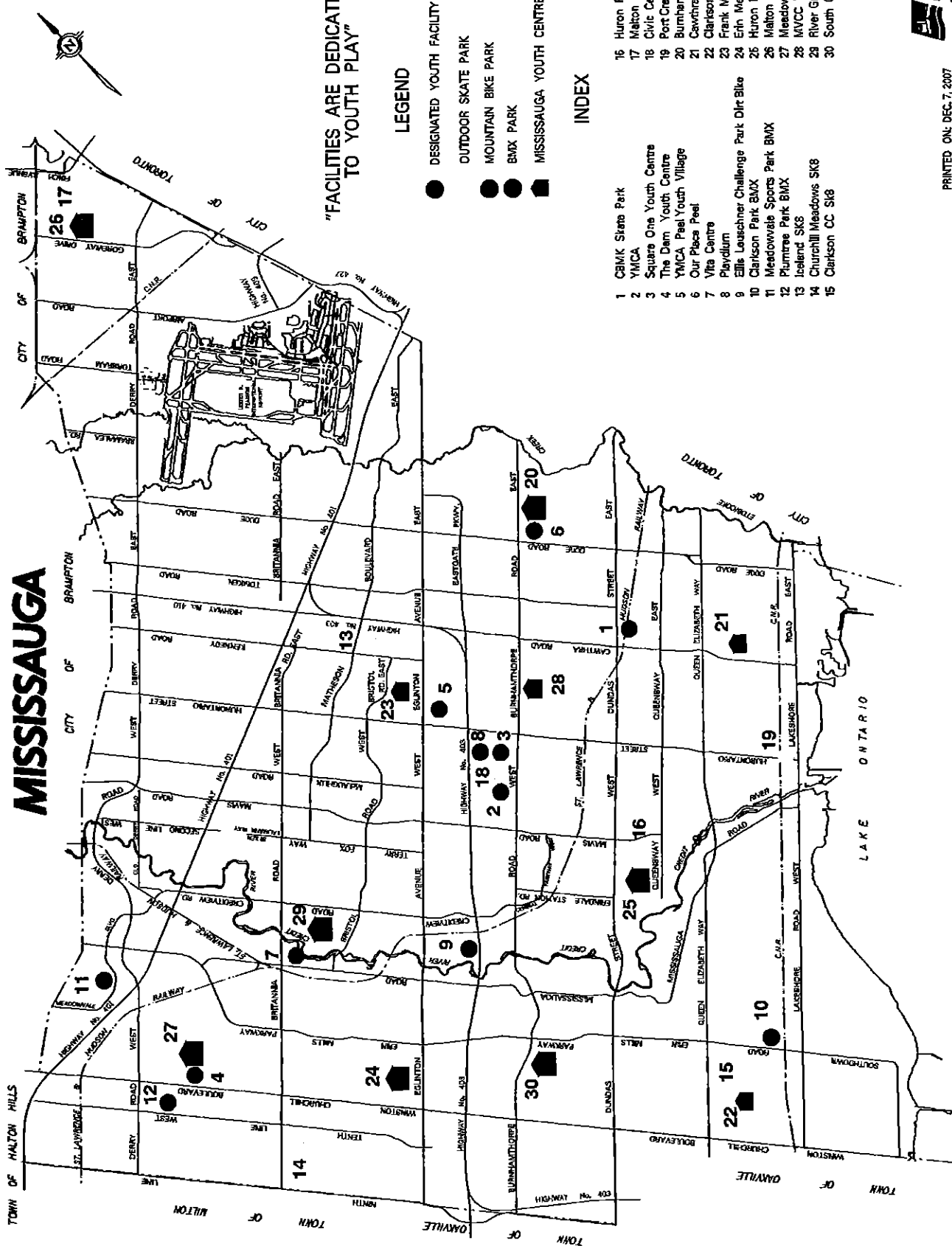
