Streetsville

History*

The first settlers to the area arrived in the spring of 1819 on the completion of the survey by Timothy Street and Richard Bristol. Street acquired 1,000 acres and went on to establish various industries within the pioneer community.

Prosperous farms surrounded the village and it gained commercial self-sufficiency in the 1830's. The backbone of Streetsville's importance was its five major mill sites along a three mile stretch of the fast flowing Credit River. The Toronto Woollen Mills, owned by the Barber family, played a large role in the economic stability of Streetsville and was a major Canadian industry at the time. In 1858 Streetsville was incorporated

as a village, with John Street as the first Reeve.

Railway development in the 1850's bypassed Streetsville. Until the opening of the Credit Valley Railway in 1879, the village depended on stagecoaches and planked roads to provide links with Toronto and points north and west.

The first half of this century brought about little change to the village apart from better roads and services. In the 1950's a steady period of expansion began with the addition of 500 acres to the village. Subdivisions began to develop on fertile farm land.

In 1962 Streetsville was granted the status of a town, with a population of 5,000. In 1974 it became part of Ward 9 in the City of Mississauga. Nevertheless, Streetsville maintains a strong community spirit and remains a distinct Village within the City.




Figure 1 - Population Pyramid










Average Total Income

Refers to the average total money received from the following sources during calendar year 1995 by persons 15 years of age and over: wages and salaries; net farm income; net non-farm income from unincorporated business and/or professional practice; federal Child Tax benefits; Old Age Security pension and Guaranteed Income Supplement; benefits from Canada or Quebec Pension Plan; benefits from Unemployment Insurance; other income from government sources; dividends, interest on bonds, deposits and savings certificates, and other investment income; retirement pensions; superannuation and annuities, including those from RRSPs and RRIFs; other money income.


Census Family

Refers to a now-married couple (with or without never-married sons and/or daughters of either or both spouses), a couple living common-law (with or without never married sons and/or daughters of either or both partners) or a lone parent of any marital status, with at least one never-married son or daughter living in the same dwelling.



Household

Refers to a person or a group of persons (other than foreign residents), who occupy the same dwelling and do not have a usual place of residence elsewhere in Canada. It may consist of a family group (census family) with or without other non-family persons, of two or more families sharing a dwelling, of a group of unrelated person, or of one person living alone.
