Malton

History

Malton was first settled in approximately 1820 and was founded by Richard Halliday from Malton in Yorkshire, England.

The intersection of Derry Road and Airport Road was the village centre known as Four Corners. In the 1840's land was cleared northwest of the Four Corners and became the village of Malton.

By the 1850's Malton grew as a service centre with stores, a cobbler's shop, a clothier shop, a blacksmith and a hotel. With the completion of the Grand Trunk Railway in 1850 and the Great Western Railway in 1859, Malton grew to be a major grain handling and export centre for the

area's wheat products and for the Meadowvale mills. It was recognized as one of the great wheat growing areas in Canada.

However, a number of factors led to the decline of Malton's agricultural export boom by the late 1850's.

In 1914 Malton acquired a new status of "police village" which allowed it to elect its own board of trustees to govern and create by-laws.

The Malton Airport, today known as the Lester B. Pearson International Airport, was begun in 1937. The Four Corners expanded with many new businesses as a result of a population

explosion brought on by the new airport. When the Victory Aircraft Company began to operate in 1940, Victory Village was developed as a subdivision on the east side of the Sixth Line East and north of the railway tracks. Other subdivisions have developed and grown since that date.

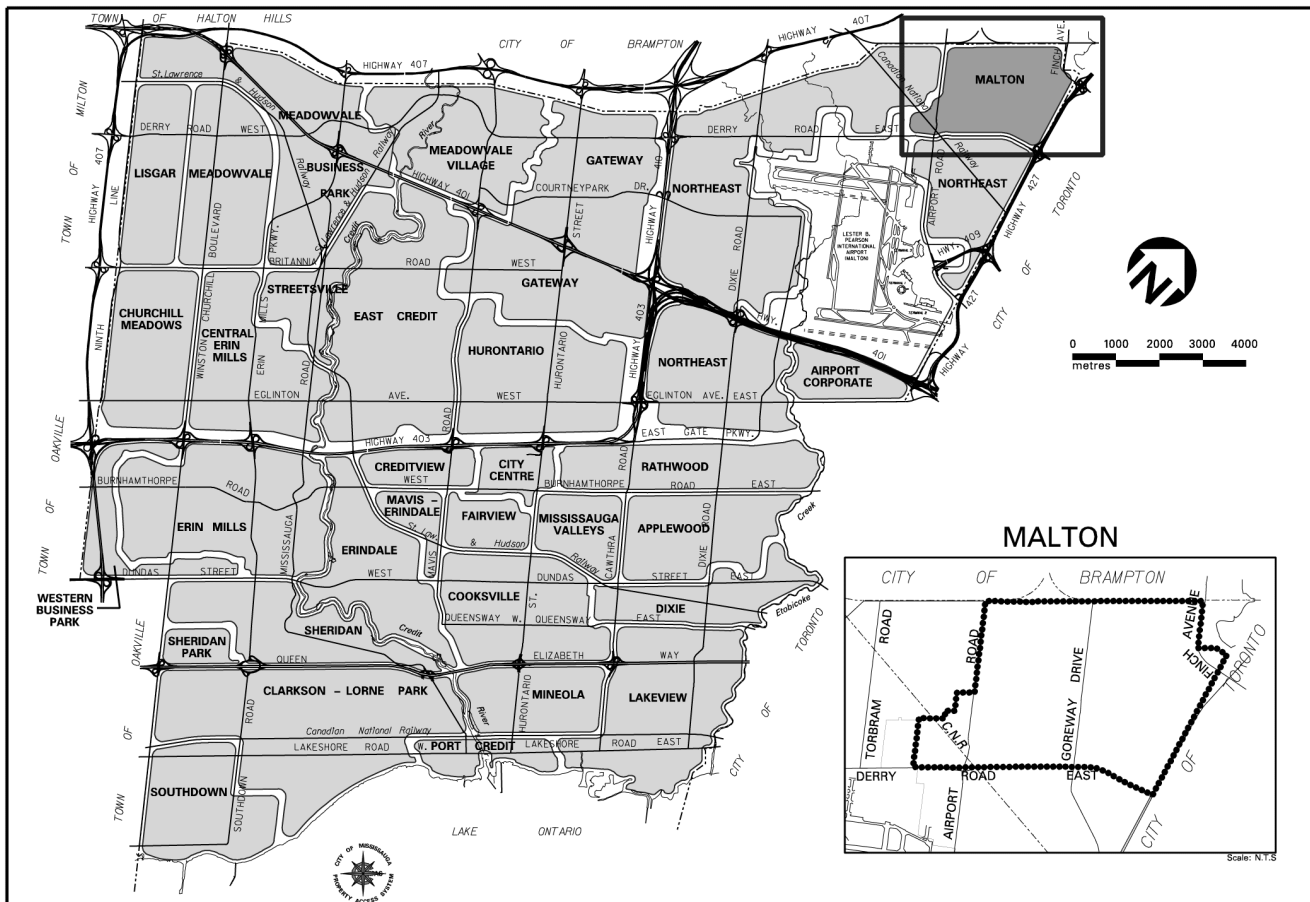


Figure 1 - Population Pyramid

(Total population 15 years and over by highest level of schooling)

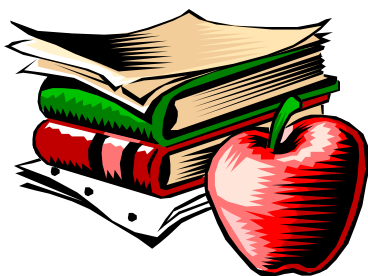
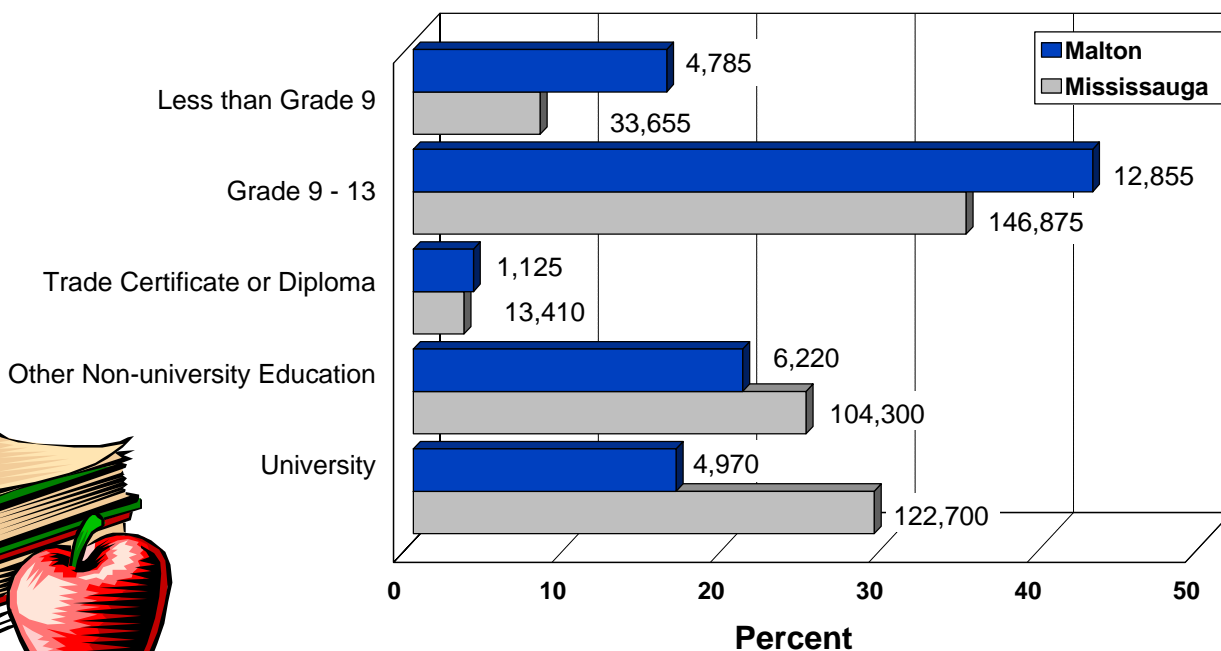

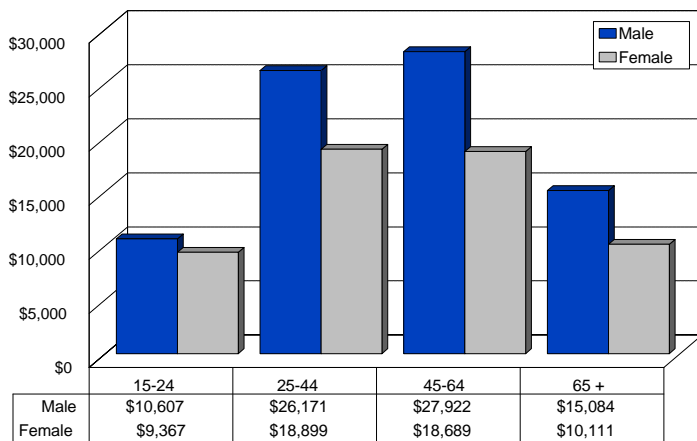

Average Total Income

Refers to the average total money received from the following sources during calendar year 1995 by persons 15 years of age and over: wages and salaries; net farm income; net non-farm income from unincorporated business and/or professional practice; federal Child Tax benefits; Old Age Security pension and Guaranteed Income Supplement; benefits from Canada or Quebec Pension Plan; benefits from Unemployment Insurance; other income from government sources; dividends, interest on bonds, deposits and savings certificates, and other investment income; retirement pensions; superannuation and annuities, including those from RRSPs and RRIFs; other money income.

Census Family

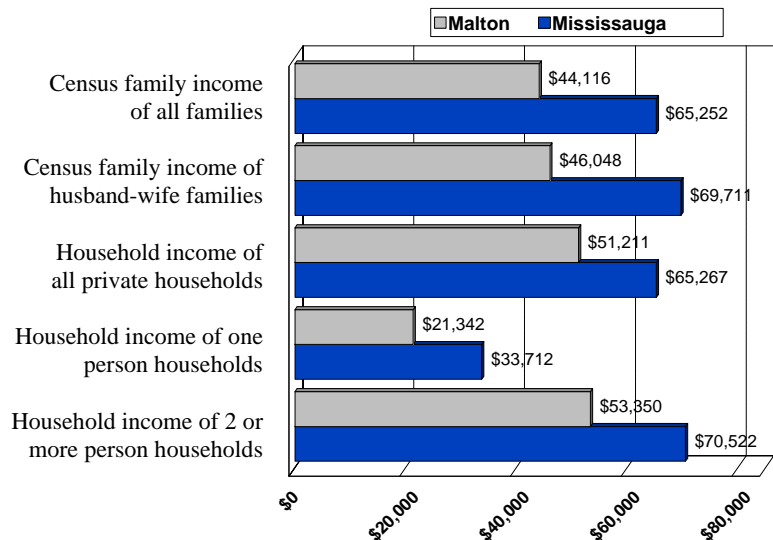
Refers to a now-married couple (with or without never-married sons and/or daughters of either or both spouses), a couple living common-law (with or without never married sons and/or daughters of either or both partners) or a lone parent of any marital status, with at least one never-married son or daughter living in the same dwelling.

Household

Refers to a person or a group of persons (other than foreign residents), who occupy the same dwelling and do not have a usual place of residence elsewhere in Canada. It may consist of a family group (census family) with or without other non-family persons, of two or more families sharing a dwelling, of a group of unrelated person, or of one person living alone.
